From the recent 1/17 VNA Council meeting

Our Neighborhood Officer Jeff Hayes addressed concerns about neighborhood incidents:

There is no issue that does not deserve attention (eg. hit and run - yes definitely report it), it helps to track trends and work on prevention. Report as follows:

1) Dane county dispatch 911 for emergency, non-emergency line 608.255.2345. The same group of people answer both numbers, and triage priorities. If you're not sure, call non-emergency and they can help determine if dispatch is needed.

- 2) Self-report online via city of Madison website : <https://www.cityofmadison.com/police/selfreport/selfreport.cfm> : These will be read and assigned if an officer needs to be involved.
- 3) Email Officer Hayes: jhayes@cityofmadison.com always an option (however, don't use for emergencies).

Use of home video footage.

These can be subpoenaed if it is critical, but otherwise police do not have access to the footage unless the homeowner offers it. It is helpful for them to know where cameras are in the neighborhood.

In the event of a disaster - one of the first things employed is canvassing neighborhood cameras. If this is required, and you are comfortable, a known network of cameras can help speed up an investigation.

Crews to Clear Storm Inlets During This Week's Potential Thaws

The City of Madison Engineering Division will continue removing snow from storm inlets while temperatures fluctuate with snow and mixed rain move through the area this week.

Crews began mid last week, and they will continue to clear inlets as warmer temperatures arrive this week.

Clearing inlets is important to prevent potential flooding. The City of Madison has 27,793 inlets in the City's stormwater sewer system. Each inlet moves water to area waterways, if the inlets are blocked with snow and ice, water can begin to pool in streets and begin ponding or create minor flooding.

The Engineering Division crews will prioritize inlets that are at lower points with an enclosed depression. Crews will also respond to calls where water is ponding.



Get Involved After the Plow Comes Through

Residents can help out by shoveling or snow blowing snow from the inlets in their neighborhoods.

The Streets Division is planning on plowing residential areas some time Tuesday afternoon, so residents should sign up for [Snow Plowing Updates](#) to learn the exact time to avoid clearing inlets a second time after plows work through the area.

Only three portions of Madison will have a Spring Primary: County Supervisor District 13, County Supervisor District 36, and the Middleton-Cross Plains Area School District.

The goal of the City Clerk's Office is that each eligible voter will be able to cast a ballot and have that ballot counted.

The Streets Division asks that all residents that park on the street to please follow these posted restrictions in order to help plow

drivers work as they push the snow back, so the roads can remain passable for all traffic throughout the rest of winter.

As snow piles up, cars park further and further out from the curb, creeping out into the travel lane. This makes it where certain streets can become impassable for emergency service vehicles (like fire trucks and ambulances) essential services (like recycling and trash collection trucks), and also just normal passenger vehicles. The only way for the streets to be widened so they can be safe for travel are for people to follow the posted parking signs so plowbacks can be performed.

[Monona Terrace to Close for Renovation in January](#)

Monona Terrace Community and Convention Center will be closing to the public for just over two weeks in January for facility improvements. The closure will begin on Tuesday, January 9, 2024 following the Madison Home Expo, through Friday, January 26, 2024. Planned projects include replacement of the facility's signature carpeting, restoration of wood doors and furniture, resurfacing of the kitchen flooring, painting throughout the building, and other repairs.

Traffic Investigation Unit

The Traffic Investigations Unit ensures that the Madison Police Department provides professional investigative services in the aftermath of vehicular crashes. Typically most vehicle collisions only require patrol response for investigative and safety purposes. The responding officer(s) will complete all necessary aspects of the vehicle collision investigation, and involved parties are provided with a case number used to access all related police reports documenting the collision. Traffic investigators, on the other hand, participate in ongoing police investigations of substantial vehicular crashes and/or hit and run collisions.

Alternate Side Parking Rules *Español*

Don't let the snow lead to a ticket or a tow. Here are few things you need to know to avoid a ticket or a tow:

- Alternate Side Parking is in effect city-wide with the exception of the [Snow Emergency Zone](#) (unless there is a [Declared Snow Emergency](#)).
- Alternate Side Parking is in effect from November 15 - March 15, seven days a week, regardless of weather conditions.
- Park on the **EVEN** house numbered side of the street on even numbered days from **1:00 am – 7:00 am**.
- Park on the **ODD** house numbered side of the street on odd numbered days from **1:00 am – 7:00 am**.

Fines

- Violations of the Alternate Side Parking rules are subject to a **fine of \$20** when a Snow Emergency **has not** been declared.
- Violations of the Alternate Side Parking rules are subject to a **fine of \$60** when a Snow Emergency **has been** declared.
