#### **Crews to Clear Storm Inlets During Thaws**

The City of Madison Engineering Division will continue removing snow from storm inlets while temperatures fluctuate. Crews will continue to clear inlets as warmer temperatures arrive. Clearing inlets is important to prevent potential flooding. The City of Madison has 27,793 inlets in the City's stormwater sewer system. Each inlet moves water to area waterways, if the inlets are blocked with snow and ice, water can begin to pool in streets and begin ponding or create minor flooding.

The Engineering Division crews will prioritize inlets that are at lower points with an enclosed depression. Crews will also respond to calls where water is ponding.

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#### Spring Primary Media Kit Is Now Available

As the February 20 Spring Primary approaches, the Madison City Clerk's Office is releasing a <u>media kit</u> to provide accurate and timely information to the media and the public.

The media kit includes essential details about the election, statistical information, and key dates.

Only three portions of Madison will have a Spring Primary: County Supervisor District 13, County Supervisor District 36, and the Middleton-Cross Plains Area School District.

The goal of the City Clerk's Office is that each eligible voter will be able to cast a ballot and have that ballot counted.

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# Follow Posted Parking Restrictions to Help Snowstorm Cleanup

Continuing throughout winter, the Streets Division will be using the posted daytime parking restrictions to prevent streets from narrowing due to the accumulating snow.

#### From the 1/17 VNA Council meeting

Our Neighborhood officer Jeff Hayes addressed concerns about neighborhood incidents:

There is no issue that does not deserve attention (eg. hit and run - yes definitely report it), it helps to track trends and work on prevention. Report as follows:

1) Dane county dispatch 911 for emergency, non-emergency line 608.255.2345. The same group of people answer both numbers, and triage priorities. If you're not sure, call non-emergency and they can help determine if dispatch is needed.

2) Self-report online via city of Madison website : https:// www.cityofmadison.com/police/selfreport/selfreport.cfm : These will be read and assigned if an officer needs to be involved.

3) Email Officer Hayes: <u>jhayes@cityofmadison.com</u> always an option (however, don't use for emergencies).

Use of home video footage.

These can be subpoenaed if it is critical, but otherwise police do not have access to the footage unless the homeowner offers it. It is helpful for them to know where cameras are in the neighborhood.

In the event of a disaster - one of the first things employed is canvassing neighborhood cameras. If this is required, and you are comfortable, a known network of cameras can help speed up an investigation.

Get Involved After the Plow Comes Through

Residents can help out during snow storms by shoveling or snow blowing snow from the inlets in their neighborhoods.

The Streets Division is planning on plowing residential areas some time Tuesday afternoon, so residents should sign up for <u>Snow Plowing Updates</u> to learn the exact time to avoid clearing inlets a second time after plows work through the area. Residents can report issues to us at 608-266 4430, <u>engineer@cityofmadison.com</u> or via the City's <u>Report-A-Problem</u> web app.

#### Be kind to the snow plow drivers,

The Streets Division asks all residents who park on the street, please follow posted restrictions to help plow drivers as they push the snow back, so roads remain passable for all traffic throughout the rest of winter.

When snow piles up, cars park further and further out from the curb into the travel lane. This means streets become impassable for emergency service vehicles (fire trucks and ambulances) essential services (recycling and trash collection trucks), and normal passenger vehicles. The only way for the streets to be widened so they can be safe for travel are for people to follow the posted parking signs so plowbacks can be performed.

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#### Alternate Side Parking Rules Español

Don't let the snow lead to a ticket or a tow. Here are few things you need to know to avoid a ticket or a tow:

- Alternate Side Parking is in effect city-wide with the exception of the <u>Snow Emergency Zone</u> (unless there is a <u>Declared Snow Emergency</u>).
- Alternate Side Parking is in effect from November 15 -March 15, seven days a week, regardless of weather conditions.
- Park on the EVEN house numbered side of the street on even numbered days from 1:00 am – 7:00 am.
- Park on the ODD house numbered side of the street on odd numbered days from 1:00 am – 7:00 am.

#### Fines

- Violations of the Alternate Side Parking rules are subject to a fine of \$20 when a Snow Emergency has not been declared.
- Violations of the Alternate Side Parking rules are subject to a **fine of \$60** when a Snow Emergency **has been** declared.
