Winter Updates: What happens when the City of Madison <u>declares a</u> <u>snow emergency</u>? Don't let the snow lead to a ticket or a tow! Sign up to get notified via <u>Text Messaging</u>.

Alternate Side Parking Rules *Español*

Don't let the snow lead to a ticket or a tow. Here are few things you need to know to avoid a ticket or a tow:

- Alternate Side Parking is in effect city-wide with the exception of the <u>Snow Emergency Zone</u> (unless there is a <u>Declared Snow</u> <u>Emergency</u>).
- Alternate Side Parking is in effect from November 15 March 15, seven days a week, regardless of weather conditions.
- Park on the **EVEN** house numbered side of the street on even numbered days from **1:00 am 7:00 am**.
- Park on the ODD house numbered side of the street on odd numbered days from 1:00 am – 7:00 am.

Fines

- Violations of the Alternate Side Parking rules are subject to a fine of \$20 when a Snow Emergency has not been declared.
- Violations of the Alternate Side Parking rules are subject to a fine of \$60 when a Snow Emergency has been declared.
