MPD officer finds new 'beat' during job shadow program: As
a patrol officer, Sydney Hanick is used to working a beat. But
during a recent shift on the north side, she found herself covering

a different kind of beat. One involving a musical mashup and the kids who attend after-school programing through the Kennedy Heights Community Center. This is the first round of the Madison Proximity Project. The program pairs an MPD officer with a community member. The officer shadows the community member, and, in return, that person goes on a police ride-along.
